SUMMER LEARNING MATTERS

During the summer, students lose 2 months of math skills.




Low-income students also lose 2+ months in reading achievement. 9 in 10 teachers* spend at least 3 weeks re-teaching lessons at the start of the school year.



Unequal access to summer learning opportunities accounts for 2/3 of the achievement gap between low- and middle-income students.

DEMAND IS HIGH IN SOUTH CAROLINA
